Housing and Dining Information

HOUSING POLICY

All full time (12 or more hours) students are required to live in residence halls with the following exceptions: (1) students living with nuclear family members (parents, grandparents, or legal guardian), in Donley County, (2) married students, (3) 21 years of age or older. The College Housing Office must approve all exceptions. The cost of the residence halls is \$575.00 per semester in Knorpp, Vaughan and Phelan. Southwest Hall and Regents Hall are \$675.00 per semester.

HOUSING FACILITIES

Clarendon College resident housing can accommodate 80 women in Knorpp Hall, 80 men in Vaughan Hall, and 40 men in Phelan Hall. Each area has a full-time Residence Hall Director living in the facility. Southwest Hall and Regents Hall are both newer dorms and may have different criteria for student occupants.

All resident housing facilities are completely furnished, air-conditioned, and tobacco-free. Each facility is equipped with vending machines and laundry facilities. Custodial services are provided routinely in the restrooms and showers of Phelan and Vaughan Halls. Custodial services are also provided in the commons areas of all Residence Halls. Cleaning of all other areas of the responsibility of the residents.

FOOD SERVICE

Students are provided meal service in the Bulldog Dining Hall seven days a week. Cost of this plan is \$1190.75 per semester for 19 meals per week. This includes 3 meals a day, Monday through Friday, brunch and dinner on Saturday and Sunday. On many items, service is rendered on an all-you-can-eat basis. Residence hall students are required to participate in the meal plan.

All exemptions to the College Housing and/or meal plan policies require documentation and must be approved by the Dean of Students.

Students must seek approval each academic year while under the policy. Any changes during the year from the initial request must be reported and approved. Students should submit requests as early as possible to avoid time delays due to last-minute volume. No arrangements should be made to live off campus until approval from the Dean of Students has been issued. Enrollment in classes cannot be completed until an approved exemption or a "Registration Authorization Pending off Campus Request Approval Form" is received from the Dean of Students. Any student under the policy and enrolled in classes without an approved exemption will be held responsible for room and/or meal fees. All information provided must be accurate. Deliberate falsification of a college document is a violation of the code of student life and may result in disciplinary action up to and including suspension from Clarendon College.
